Power Of Praise



As Christians, many of us often forget that we are fighting a spiritual battle, or it seems to be an after-thought to the physical world in which we live. Sometimes we may sing to sing, read the word to read, or play instruments just to play, but something is happening in the supernatural realm that we cannot see. Through every single note, prayer, and application of the word to our lives, chains are being broken to the people that surround us. Some people need to hear your PRAISE, they need to feel that spirit, love, and passion of a Christian who truly knows how to worship God in spirit and truth. It is not your singing that does the fighting but it is your praise to the Holy One that causes the mountains to shake and the people to tremble in the Spirit.

We see the power of praise in the book of Acts when Paul and Silas are locked up in prison shackled and have no other thing to do besides praising God, "...and immediately all the doors were opened, and everyone's bond was unfastened" (Acts 16:25 ESV). As their praises grew louder and louder eventually the whole prison came crumbling down and as a result of praise, the prison guard gave his life to Christ. Paul and Silas were still able to worship wholeheartedly, without a care in the world that they were in prison. The power of praise can lead others to Christ and break the bondage of those that surround you.

Another example we see is Joshua. He and his army were outside the walls of Jericho for an entire week marching and blowing trumpets. Joshua obeying the





word of God marches and on the last day calls for his people to "...shout for the Lord has given you the city" (Joshua 6:16 ESV). Through praises and obedience, God moved and Israel conquered their new city. Persistent praise and obedience have the power to break down barriers. The only thing that is stopping you from conquering is the lack of persistence in your praise. Shout! Get excited! Sing a new song! God has the victory. Just praise Him.

One last example of praise was in the battle between Israel and the Amalekites in the book of Exodus. Moses was required to go on top of the mountain and lift his hands so that Israel can prevail. DEFINING THE CALL













"Who do you say I am?" is a question Jesus asked His disciples and is recorded in three of the four gospels. At some point in all of our lives, we have been faced with a similar question. It is the most important question we will ever answer. Who do we say Jesus is?

Jesus began the conversation with His disciples by asking a related question: "Who do the crowds say I am?" (Luke 9:18). In response, they let Him know what they had heard. The opinions included John the Baptist, Elijah, Jeremiah, or one of the other prophets. He then directs His question at the disciples, "What about you? Who do you say I am?" Almost immediately after this question was asked, Peter answers, "You are The Messiah, the Son of the living God." This phrase is so important, 'Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of the living God.' When Peter said this, he was declaring that he believed that Jesus was God Himself. And although Peter walked with Jesus, witnessed miracles, and even walked on water, he did not solely discover this by observation and investigation, but through revelation. Jesus responds to Peter, "Blessed are you, for flesh and blood did not reveal this to you, but my Father who is in heaven." (Matthew 16:17)



FROM DYSFUNCTIONAL TO FUNCTIONAL

The word dysfunctional was a word I heard a lot throughout my early youth and although I really tried to ignore its meaning and those who used it towards me; I could never shake off the reality, that in all the aspects of my life this was the word that could be used to define me. I was a dysfunctional person. The word dysfunctional can be simply defined as something that is not working or operating in the proper and or normal way; and before having my encounter with God nothing in my life was working properly, nothing in my life was normal, nothing was working the way it should.

See I come from a dysfunctional home; at a young age my parents split up. This split up was very heartbreaking and caused me and my brothers to have a very dysfunctional childhood. Family park days, dinners, or movie nights were not a thing in my house. In my house, everyone chose their own corner of solitude and stuck with it. The pain we felt by my parent's separation and the loneliness experienced in the home caused me and my brothers to each take our own paths and while doing so we created a dysfunctional sibling relationship. We always loved each other; we always had our backs however we just never knew what was going on in each other's lives. Everything was a domino effect; because of our parent's separation, we as brothers also separated. This caused us to enter dysfunctional friendships and lifestyles, trying to fill empty voids left from all the pain and loneliness caused in the past.

dysfunctional home, dysfunctional sibling relationship, and dysfunctional friendships all caused one major problem in my life, a dysfunctional spiritual lifestyle. During all this time my mother was a woman of God, who dedicated herself to prayer and the service of God. She would constantly take us to church, but our broken hearts, torn spirit, and lack of focus would never let God in to fix everything that was not working properly. I would always go to church, but I was far from God. But the great thing about God is that it doesn't matter how far we are from Him, He is always close to us. I remember one service, in particular, God used one of his servants to give me a word, he said "God is calling you, to use you in ministry. But before all of that, you first need to focus on him. He will fix everything; He will put everything in working order." I remember telling myself "There is no way He can use me; I am a mess; my family is a mess." I share this story because there might be many of you out there thinking the same thing, wanting to be used by God, but saying to yourself "there is no way God can use me, I am a mess."

Well, let me tell you that you couldn't be farther from the truth. Throughout Scripture, we can see great evidence that God used dysfunctional men and women to do remarkable and unforgettable things. People like Joseph, Moses, Jephthah, Samson, Rahab, Ruth, David, Salomon, Ester, Hosea, all the Apostles, and the list could go on. All of these were broken men and women, dysfunctional people; but God fixed them and used for







his glory and purpose. Do you want something a little closer to home? Look at the leaders and teachers of the congregation you're in, look at you're a pastor; get close, hear their story. Behind every suit and tie, behind every pulpit, behind every successful ministry, there's a story of how God took a broken man or woman and restored them completely. A story of how God took them from a dysfunctional state to a functional state. I encourage you, to get closer and hear their story.

I was blessed enough to have a mother that constantly prayed for me. Because of that prayer, I had an encounter with God; I was fifteen years old and one day I was invited to a waterpark with some dysfunctional friends of mine. In this waterpark, I was doing things that I for sure knew were not pleasing God. In an instant I was left alone, the park felt empty, and I remember feeling the voice of the Spirit of God speaking to my heart saying, "Leo I can no longer be in here, there's no space for me, I must leave." And at that moment, I felt loneliness strike my heart like never before, the loneliness I have experienced before could not compare to this moment. See I was never really alone, God was always with me. But until this moment I have never experienced true loneliness. The Spirit of God could no longer make my heart his home because now I have given my heart to sin. Talk about an all-time low, talk about reaching the lowest point of being dysfunctional. I was completely alone. On the trip back home, I felt desperate. I felt like I couldn't breathe, I felt like my life was over. I was in the corner of the bus crying all the way home wondering what my next step would be. By the time I reached my house, I finally knew what my next step was.

I ran to my room, shut my door, and began screaming out "God forgive me, please come back; I need you and only you!" At that moment I felt the biggest relief as the Holy spirit re-entered my life. The room lit up and I experienced the presence of God like never before. Surprisingly no one outside my room heard or realized what was going on. But on that day, God officially began restoring my life, turning me from dysfunctional to functional. Wonderful things happened, I accepted Christ; I was baptized in the Holy Spirit. I began my education in the wonderful school of AJEC. God gave me great friends along the way that pushed me and encouraged me to continue looking for God. Also, God placed wonderful pastors and mentors in my path to guide me in the ministry. So many wonderful things have happened since the moment I had an encounter with God, time won't be enough to tell

them all.



However, it's important to share, that due to that first encounter, years later, my family is now experiencing the best moments ever. I and my brothers have never been closer; God has also given me an opportunity to have a family of my own, I am married with three kids and one on the way. And the best news of all is that God's promise was fulfilled, and I began working in the ministry. In July of 2020, we were given the opportunity to open a church in the same neighborhood that witnessed me, and my brothers come from a dysfunctional family. Not only that, but all the members of this once dysfunctional family now in some way or collaborating so that the gospel of Christ gets preached. The purpose of all of this is for you to see that your past experiences and you're scarred life should not and will not determine your future success in Christ. The more weight you have on your shoulders, the deeper you will sink into his presence, don't

be afraid; get in deeper with God, let Him restore you, let Him write your story. It doesn't matter how much of a mess your life is; God will restore you and do great things with you.

I hope that my short story would motivate you to allow God to take you from the present dysfunctional state that you might find yourself in, to the glorious functional state that He desires to have you in. Romans 12:2 says the following "Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is; his good, pleasing, and perfect will." Leave that dysfunctional lifestyle behind and enter God's perfect functional state where you will find God's will for you, which is good, pleasing, and perfect.
